Grand Prix Coming To Town

The 41st Annual Toyota Grand Prix of Long Beach is coming to town **Friday through Sunday April 17-19**. The race is Long Beach's annual "Spring Break" party and is expected to attract more than 170,000 fans over the 3-day weekend.



The featured race is Sunday afternoon's **Verizon IndyCar Series** event which will draw an international field of world class drivers expected to include defending Series champion **Will Power**, three-time Series champ **Scott Dixon**, Long Beach winners **Takuma Sato**, **Ryan Hunter-Reay**, **Helio Castoneves**, and **Sebastian Bourdais**, along with **Graham Rahal** and **Marco Andretti**. The Series will have cars with turbocharged engines supplied

by Honda and Chevrolet.

Other races over the weekend include the SPEED Energy Formula Off-Road Race, Tequila Patrón Sports Car Showcase, Indy Lights presented by Cooper Tires, the Pirelli World Challenge Championship, and the Super Drift Challenge.

A fan favorite is always the **Pro-Celebrity Race** to be run on **Saturday, April 18**. The race pits stars from the worlds of sports and entertainment against professional drivers in identically prepared Scion FR-S vehicles. Eighteen celebrities and pros are expected to take the green flag.

Sheriff McDonnell on Straight Talk

LA County Sheriff Jim McDonnell was elected in November 2014 and sworn in as the 32nd Sheriff of Los Angeles County on December 1, 2014.

He joins us to discuss his plans for the challenges facing the Department, including dealing with jailhouse violence and the problems triggered by realignment and the passage of Prop 47.

Sheriff McDonnell is a Boston native who grew up in a working class neighborhood a stone's throw from Fenway Park. He came to Los Angeles over three decades ago with little more than a dream to be part of protecting and serving the public. He was born to immigrant parents who instilled in him the values that have served as the guideposts throughout his life: **hard work, integrity** and **treating all people with respect**.

Sheriff McDonnell served for 29 years at the Los Angeles

Police Department, rising to second-in-command under Chief Bill Bratton, and then served for five years as Chief of the Long Beach Police Department.

Ethics and Politics

The dysfunctional government at the national and state level these past few years is of great concern to many citizens. Seeing our elected representatives at loggerheads and unable or unwilling to respond to the wishes of a majority of the electorate is a source of increasing frustration to the electorate.

How about applying to politics the widely accepted ethical principles which we try to follow in our daily lives? Principles such as **honesty, integrity, accountability, fairness, transparency, and promise-keeping**. Imagine how the application of these principles could transform the political arena. The current gulf between accepted principles and political behavior is certainly one of the reasons that politicians are held in such a low regard.

Many political practices offend the notion of common sense and fairness. The **“gut and amend”** practice of substituting one bill for another at the very last moment and then having a vote without any hearings and without even giving legislators a chance to read the bill defies logic. The **misuse of the filibuster** in the Senate makes it impossible for a simple majority to enact legislation on any matter of importance.

Gerrymandered districts allow the political parties in effect to pick their voters rather than having the voters elect their representatives. The **misuse of emergency relief bills**, such as for Hurricane Sandy, as convenient vehicles to load with pork and carry legislators’ pet projects

without hearings or adequate review is unsupported. And the **role of money** in political process needs re-examination.

Is it not time for re-districting reform, as enacted in California, to spread to other states? It is not time to change the Senate rules to limit the misuse of the filibuster? Shouldn't emergency relief bills be restricted to appropriations that directly respond to the emergency? Shouldn't we at least have immediate and full disclosure of all campaign contributors by the true donor (not just some “front committee”) so that voters will know who is really behind a candidate?

These and other needed reforms would be good starting points to create a government worthy of the people it represents. Ultimately, the entire social contract is based upon an **implied agreement between the people and our leaders**. We entrust those who govern us with an immense amount of authority and power, and they need to exercise that power ethically and in public interest.



Police Chief to Speak at Future Focus

Long Beach Chief of Police **Robert Luna** will be the guest speaker at the next *Future Focus Forum* at Temple Israel on **Thursday, April 16** at 7:30 pm.

His topic, *The Future of Police- Community Relations*, will address an issue that has emerged over the past year as a major subject of national discussion after the deaths of several African-Americans following confrontations with white police officers. These incidents sparked a number of protests in cities across the nation, and inspired reflections at the national, state and local levels about the relationship between law enforcement agencies and the communities they are sworn to serve and protect.

Robert Luna was appointed as Long Beach's 26th Chief of Police in November 2014. Chief Luna has served the City of Long Beach for 29 years. His work in the Long Beach Police Department has covered a variety of assignments, including Special Weapons & Tactics (SWAT), homicide, drugs, gang investigations and communications.

Chief Luna's education includes attendance at the FBI National Executive Institute and the FBI National Academy, Master of Public Administration (MPA) and Bachelor of Vocational Education (BVE) degrees from California State University,

Long Beach. He is also a graduate of the Harvard University Senior Executives in State and Local Government Program and the USC Delinquency Control Institute.

Chief Luna's remarks will be followed by an audience Q&A and then a Reception catered by **Gelson's Supermarket**. The program is open to all members of the community without charge.



Future Focus is a speaker series launched in May 2013 at Temple Israel. It is designed to create a forum for community leaders to identify and address issues critical to the future development and well-being of our City. Previous *Future Focus* speakers were Mayor **Bob Foster** and former California Governor **George Deukmejian**.



President Conoley on Straight Talk

California State University, Long Beach

Jane Close Conoley became the seventh President of California State University, Long Beach when she assumed the office on July 15, 2014.

Dr. Conoley comes to the University at a time when everyone also seems to want to come to the Beach — with over 80,000 applications last year for 6,000 places. She is faced with the challenges of trying to expand enrollment at a time of severe budget restraints, accelerating the time it takes students to graduate, and continuing to focus on student success. A \$225 million major fundraising campaign was recently announced to help with these efforts. Over **\$200 million** has already been raised.

The Straight Talk interview with Dr. Conoley will be webcast throughout the world on the University website as part of the CSULB Graduation Ceremonies the week of May 19 through May 22.

Bio

Prior to becoming the President of CSULB, Dr. Conoley was the interim Chancellor of the University of California Riverside. She has also held leadership positions at the University of California Santa Barbara, Texas A&M University, and at the University of Nebraska Lincoln. Dr. Conoley is the author, co-author or editor of over one hundred twenty books, articles, and book chapters. Her latest book “Positive Psychology and Family Therapy” was co-authored with her husband, Dr. Collie W. Conoley.

She serves on numerous journal editorial and community service boards. She has received research, teaching and service honors during her career. Both the American Psychological Association and the Association of Psychological Science honored Dr. Conoley with fellow status. Her research and development efforts in school safety, teacher quality and student achievement have been supported by over 20 million dollars in external federal, state and private funds.

Who Can Speak before Congress?

House Speaker John Boehner's recent invitation to Israeli Prime Minister **Benjamin Netanyahu** to speak before Congress on March 3 has proven controversial for a number of reasons.

First, Netanyahu is right in the middle of an Israeli election campaign, and it might appear to some that the Congress is endorsing him.

Second, President Obama relaxed economic sanctions on Iran in an effort to facilitate negotiations over Iran's nuclear capability. Netanyahu and the Republicans have argued that Iran has been stalling, and therefore the tougher sanctions should be reinstated. Accordingly, Speaker Boehner chose **not to consult** with the President before inviting Netanyahu.

Third, it may seem unusual to some to have a foreign leader address the legislative body of the United States government.

Allow me to put these concerns to rest by examining some precedents.

According to the U.S. Constitution, Congress is the sole law-making body of the government. In fact, Speaker Boehner is suing the President for over-stepping his executive authority and violating the separation of powers doctrine. The Speaker, who is elected by the members of the House, has the authority to invite whomever he likes to speak before Congress as part of his duties.

Foreign leaders have addressed the Congress, starting with **The Marquis de Lafayette** in 1824. Shortly after the devastating attack on Pearl Harbor, **Winston Churchill** came to cement America's World War II alliance with Great Britain. He returned in 1943 to bolster the war effort and again in 1952 during his second term as Prime Minister.

More recent speakers may be seen as more relevant to the case at hand. Israeli Prime Minister **Yitzhak Rabin** spoke before the Congress in 1976 and 1994. In 1978, peacemakers **Anwar Sadat** of Egypt and **Menachem Begin** of Israel spoke on the same day. In fact, Netanyahu himself spoke before Congress in 1996 and 2011. However, those speakers all had the **approval of the sitting president**. The current invitation to Netanyahu did not. But even this slight is **not without precedent**.

The most notorious case was the invitation to **General**

Douglas MacArthur. The popular general, who had led the United States to victory in the Pacific during World War II, had been recalled to duty by President **Harry Truman** with the advent of the Korean War in 1950. MacArthur reversed a desperate situation when he reinforced the embattled perimeter around Pusan. He then launched his own counter-offensive at Inchon, pushing the North Korean army back across its northern border with Red China.

MacArthur then asked for permission to demolish the bridges over the Yalu River separating North Korea from China. The President turned him down. Soon Chinese soldiers crossed the Yalu and pushed the Americans south. MacArthur asked for authority to use tactical nuclear weapons against the Chinese. Again, President Truman refused the request, arguing that it was beyond the "police action" authorized by the United Nations. When MacArthur complained to the press, Truman removed him for insubordination.

Truman was already unpopular because of the fall of China to Mao Zedong and the communists, the Soviet Union's development of the atomic bomb, and the internal threat of subversion by Communist agents. His firing of MacArthur was the last straw for Republicans, who controlled the Congress. Infuriating the President, they invited MacArthur to speak on April 19, 1951. The address was broadcast live over the nation's growing television network. MacArthur rose to the occasion with a memorable 37-minute speech that ended dramatically with the lines, "*Old soldiers never die, they just fade away. And like that old soldier . . . I now close my military career and just fade away, an old soldier who tried to do his duty as God gave him the light to see that duty. Good bye.*"

Many members of the House and Senate could be seen weeping as MacArthur left the lectern. He became a possible presidential candidate. Truman's approval ratings continued to plummet, and he eventually withdrew from the 1952 presidential race.

MacArthur was a **willing knight** in the Republican chess game with Truman. **Netanyahu is the Republican's knight** this time around. President Obama needs to be very careful about what counter moves he makes.




