CSULB President King Alexander Looks Ahead



Dr. F. King Alexander is President of California State University, Long Beach.

Dr. F. King Alexander was named the sixth President of California State University, Long Beach in November of 2005 after serving as the

President of Murray State University in Kentucky from 2001-2005. California State University, Long Beach is the nation's 25th largest university and is recognized as a "university of choice" among students throughout California and the western United States.

Dr. Alexander is a well respected national expert in domestic and international higher education finance and public policy. His research on university revenue and expenditure patterns has been featured in The Economist, The New York Times, The Chronicle of Higher Education, The Boston Globe, The Australian, and The Christian Science Monitor. Dr. Alexander's efforts to improve federal higher education policy has contributed to the development of Congressional legislation advancing the "net tuition concept" in order to enhance public accountability and future funding of higher education institutions.

Prior to serving as president of two public universities Dr. Alexander was a faculty member and director of the Higher Education Program at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign from 1997-2001. In addition to being President of California State University, Long Beach he also serves as a faculty affiliate at Cornell University's Higher Education Research Institute (CHERI).

Dr. Molina received his degree from the University of Southern California and performed his internship and residency at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Maryland. He is board certified in Internal Medicine as well as in Endocrinology and Metabolism.



Seaport Marina Project Up for Approval

CSULB Gets New Head Basketball Coach



Dan Monson is Head Men's Basketball Coach at Long Beach State.

Dan Monson was named as the new Head Men's Basketball Coach at Long Beach State on April 7, 2007. Monson has been a Division I head coach for 10 years, most recently

at the University of Minnesota. In ten years as a collegiate head coach Monson has a career record of 170-123, with seven trips to post-season play. Monson is the 16th head coach in Long Beach State men's basketball history.

Prior to accepting the Minnesota job in 1999, Monson was the head coach at Gonzaga for two years. In 1998-99 he led the Bulldogs to within a breath of the Final Four. Gonzaga, which went 28-7 on the year, defeated such notable NCAA powers as Minnesota, Stanford and Florida before bowing out in the Elite Eight to the eventual national champion, Connecticut.

All told, Monson spent 11 years helping build the Gonzaga program. He began as an assistant coach in 1988 and spent six years laying the groundwork. In 94/95 he was elevated to associate head coach under head coach Dan Fitzgerald. Three years later he took over full control of the Gonzaga program. He led Gonzaga to a West Coast Conference title in 1998 when the squad set a school record, and was named the **WCC Coach of the Year.**

Vic Cegles is Director of Athletics at Long Beach State.

Victor Cegles was selected as Director of Athletics at Long Beach State in April, 2006. Cegles came to Long Beach from Temple University, where he was the senior associate athletic director for external affairs for the past



three years. Cegles is the **12th Director of Athletics** in the school's history and brings a wealth of collegiate experience with him to Long Beach.

He served 16 years at Arizona State University in athletic development and external affairs. While at Arizona State he led the athletics department's \$25 million capital campaign to enhance facilities and endowments and, among other responsibilities, supervised baseball, men's and women's golf, and women's gymnastics. He also was the assistant athletic director for development at Rutgers University for five years.

He holds a B.S. degree in business administration from Bucknell and a master's in counseling and student personnel services from Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Cegles and his wife Bonnie have two sons, Vic who is a junior at Rutgers University and Casey, a sophomore at Towson University.

The Observance commences with a procession of Color Guard units representing the branches of our armed forces, veterans groups and local police

Other events will include: the traditional release of 100 doves and 1,500 balloons, members of the Patriot Guard Riders, special performances by Rodeo Drive Music, Navy Sea Cadets, the 21st Century Skydiving Team and the Navy Seals Skydiving Team. Music will be provided by the Brass Quintet from Navy Band Southwest, and the Cabar Feidh Bagpipe Band. The program will conclude with a pres-

entation of memorial wreaths, a 21-Gun Salute, the playing of Taps, flyovers, and a musical tribute.

Who Are Our Friends, Anyway?

Reflecting upon Israel's 59th Birthday and the Significance of Our Country's Friendship with the Jewish State

It is a lesson that each of us has likely addressed with a teenager, or learned ourselves, at some point. How can we know who our true friends really are and how can we avoid friends who would betray us? However we phrase our responses to our children's painful betrayals, they usually center on the following principles. True friends share an outlook on life or genuinely respect each other's divergent perspectives. True friends share interests and passions or, at least, champion one another. True friends stand by one another in difficult times and support one another in moments of vulnerability. True friends do not turn away because it is expedient in the moment to do so.

Of course, no analogy can be carried to its extreme if it is to remain useful. The analogy of friendships enjoyed or endured by teenagers to geopolitical relationships falls short; the gravity of misplaced geo-political alliances is far greater and dire in consequence than that of any personal friendship. Therefore, as the State of Israel turns 59 years young, evermore a modern miracle exemplifying the spirit of liberty and democracy, and as we reconsider our military strategies in the Middle East, it behooves our nation, only 231 years young this coming July, to ask the question, who are our friends, anyway?

The recent release of the Baker-Hamilton Report on the war in Iraq has stirred a great deal of controversy. The report suggests that our country ought to engage the Iranians and the Syrians in dialogue to stem their support of the various terrorist movements in Iraq that kill and maim Iraqi civilians and Iraqi and American soldiers daily and seek to undermine our objectives. The report suggests that through negotiations, the Iranians and Syrians might be persuaded to be helpful. At what cost? At the cost of our friends, of course. Though not stated in the report, the implication is inescapable, given that there is little other than Israel's land or its security that can be sold to the Syrians or Iranians in exchange for their "friendship." In the case of the Syrians, there is no need to extrapolate; the report puts Israel's Golan Heights, a plateau used by the Syrians to terrorize Israelis for decades, squarely on the table for consideration.

It's not nearly as complicated a question as we might think. Our friends are those who stand with us in our times of need. Our friends are those upon whom we can rely when we are less than popular at any given moment. Our friends are those with whom we share common values, common purposes and a shared view of the world.

By these standards, it should be apparent to every American that we have only one true friend in the Middle East. It is not Syria. It is not Iran. Happy birthday, Israel, our friend in spirit and our truest ally!

Ed. Note: April 24, 2007 was the 59th Anniversary of the founding of the State of Israel.

Ken Walker At 80 is Still Going Strong

Kenneth Walker, third generation and life-long Long Beach advocate, and CEO and President of Farmers & Merchants Bank (F&M), turned 80

years old on April 17, 2007.

Kenneth was born in Long Beach in 1927 at Seaside Hospital. He attended Los Cerritos Elementary School, Washington Jr. High and Poly High School.

At the request of his grandfather and F&M founder, C. J. Walker, Ken began working at F&M at age eleven as the elevator operator and groundskeeper of the Long Beach head-quarters. He later studied finance, accounting and economics at USC after serving in the U.S. Navy. Following his military service, Kenneth married and returned to work at F&M as a teller in 1948, moonlighting as a machine shop operator after hours and a farmer in Arizona on the weekends. In the ensuing years, he worked in almost every conceivable banking capacity at F&M until becoming its executive vice president in 1965. Kenneth succeeded his father, Gus Walker, as president, in 1979. He remains involved in various key aspects of the business, including oversight of investments, loans and personnel matters.

Ken has been a Long Beach advocate and humanitarian for over 60 years, actively serving on boards and committees of such organizations as the Assistance League of Long Beach, Long Beach Memorial Medical Center, YMCA of Greater Long Beach and the National Conference for Community & Justice. He and his wife Nancy were honored last year with the **YMCA Family Life Award** for their faithful activity with local groups in the Long Beach community.

Kenneth and Nancy reside in Buena Park. They have 4 grown children, 11 grandchildren, and 2 great-grandchildren.
